VARAC groups Vintage Historic and Classic/Modern Classic car/driver combinations by lap time brackets creating fair, competitive and equitable racing

Brackets for the tracks we run on are per the table below. For example, if you run "under 2.03" at Le Circuit Mont Tremblant you are a Group 3-if VH, you're a VH3-if Classic you're a CL3. So, For Peter Jackson entry you would enter as VH3 (or CL3). As the event goes on you can adjust—see the Race Director (Dave Good)

Breakouts

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A "Break Out" occurs when a driver, in a Qualifying or Race session, turns a faster time than the upper/fastest limit for a class.

Competitors that break out in this last session will be moved to the new class at that point and are not considered for podium or trophies.
